

ANTI-DRUG STRATEGIES IMPLEMENTED IN DIXIE DISTRICT SCHOOLS

- Passed student drug testing policy with input from community, students, staff and school board
- Implemented random staff drug testing to include ALL employees
- Formed community wide Drug Advisory Committee
- In the past one and one-half years, 125 students and staff have been tested with 2 positive student and 1 positive staff test.
- Two School Resource Officers (School District funds ½ and Sheriff's Office funds ½)
- Red ribbon week (anti drug program) in elementary schools
- DARE program in elementary schools by the Dixie County Sheriff's Department
- School Resource officers in classrooms at the middle and high school educating students about drug abuse. The resource officers have been in classrooms in the last month educating our students about the dangers of the new outbreak with bath salts
- School District funds optional Alternative School Program
- Ordered a drug education curriculum at DCHS
- Received input on drug concerns from: Superintendents cabinet, community drug committee, school advisory committee, staff and local law enforcement.
- Drug dogs on middle and high school campus at least monthly on a random basis----in student and staff parking lots, lockers, and classrooms.
- Moved DCHS student parking to far west end of campus.....students no longer have access to vehicles during the school day.
- Increased supervision in restrooms at DCHS
- Restricted check out policy at DCHS
- Restricted hall passes at DCHS
- Breathalyzer use implemented at Junior/Senior Prom
- Anonymous call in for illegal and drug activity opportunity for students (498-6130)
- K-9 dog awareness program at elementary schools
- Larry Taylor anti drug programs at elementary schools
- DCHS Principal provides drug test to parents who wish to test their student. This is strictly voluntarily
- Camera systems monitored by SRO's concerning drug situations
