

NOTICE OF TAX FOR SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY

The School Board of Dixie County will soon consider a measure to impose a 1.50 mill property tax for the capital outlay projects listed herein.

This tax is in addition to the school board's proposed tax of 6.396 mills for operating expenses and is proposed solely at the discretion of the school board.

The capital outlay tax will generate approximately \$729,303 to be used for the s projects:

CONSTRUCTION AND REMODELING

- District Wide Remodeling Projects
- District Wide Small Projects and Walkways
- Plant Survey Construction Projects

MAINTENANCE, RENOVATION, AND REPAIR

- Facilities Maintenance, Repairs and Improvement District wide
- Roof Repairs
- Paving Parking Lots and Access Roads
- Storm Water Management
- HVAC/Fire Alarms/Sprinkler/Intercom/Security Systems/Energy Management

MOTOR VEHICLE PURCHASES

- Purchase of Two (2) School Buses

NEW AND REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND ENTERPRISE SOFTWARE

- District Wide Furniture and Equipment
- Data Processing Equipment and Systems
- Security Cameras
- Software
- District Wide Enterprise Technology

PAYMENT OF COSTS OF COMPLIANCE WITH ENVIRONMENTAL STATUTES & REGULATIONS

- Asbestos Abatement/Removal
- Removal of Hazardous Waste
- Environmental Compliance

PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS FOR PROPERTY AND CASUALTY INSURANCE NECESSARY TO INSURE THE EDUCATIONAL & ANCILLARY PLANTS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Projects are defined in the Districts annual Capital Improvement Plan and in the Five Year Facility Survey. There are insufficient funds to complete all projects on the list which requires periodic reassignment of priorities. The lack of funds prevents an accurate advertised list of projects to be completed during the fiscal year. The plans are available for review in the district Facilities office
